VISA INFORMATION

Some NPFC Members will only need an electronic travel authorization (eTA) to enter Canada while other Members and CNCPs are required to have a visa when travelling to Canada. Please see <https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/visit-canada/entry-requirements-country.html> to find out if you can enter Canada with an eTA or need a visa.

An official Letter of Invitation is essential for participants to apply for a Canadian visa. Each delegate who applies for a Canadian visa is requested to provide information in the form of Attachment 1 at the earliest date possible to Dr. Janelle Curtis (Janelle.Curtis@dfo-mpo.gc.ca), who will arrange for this Letter of Invitation.

ACCOMMODATION

Each participant is responsible for making his or her own hotel arrangements. Recommended hotels are listed in the table below. Note that December will be a busy time in Nanaimo, so it is best to book your room early. 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AIRPORT INFORMATION AND TRANSPORT TO THE MEETING VENUE

From Vancouver International Airport to Nanaimo

Nanaimo’s weather is somewhat unpredictable in December. Strong winds and fog can sometimes influence travel from Vancouver International Airport (YVR) to Nanaimo Airport (YCD). It is therefore a good idea to arrive the morning of the day before a meeting starts so that you have the rest of the day to make alternative travel plans (e.g. take a ferry across the Salish Sea) and ensure a timely arrival in Nanaimo.

- You can catch a connecting flight from Vancouver International Airport (YVR) to the Nanaimo Airport (YCD). This is the most straightforward alternative, and the trip takes about 20 minutes and usually costs a few hundred Canadian dollars (CAD). Taxis from YCD to Nanaimo take approximately 20 minutes and will cost around \$50-60 CAD.
- You can catch a ferry from Vancouver to Nanaimo. There are two main routes (see <https://www.bcf ferries.com/routes-fares/schedules>). The first route involves a ½ hour taxi ride from YVR to the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal. From there the crossing takes 2 hours across the Salish Sea, and then there is about a ½ hour taxi ride from Duke Point Ferry Terminal to downtown Nanaimo. The second route involves a 1 hour taxi ride from YVR to the Horseshoe Bay Ferry Terminal. From there the crossing takes just over 1.5 hours across the Salish Sea to Departure Bay Ferry Terminal, which is a 5-10 minute taxi ride to downtown Nanaimo. A one-way fare on either ferry route is \$18 CAD.
- There may be another fast ferry running by December 2023 between downtown Vancouver and downtown Nanaimo. We don’t have route details yet but you can keep an eye out for announcements at <https://www.vifc.com/>.
- You can take a float plane from YVR to downtown Nanaimo. Take a free shuttle or a \$20 taxi from YVR to either Harbour Air Seaplanes (<https://harbourair.com/>) or Seair Seaplanes (<https://www.seairseaplanes.com/>). From there it is about a 15-20 minute flight to Nanaimo.

Seair Seaplanes is a 5-10 minutes taxi ride to downtown Nanaimo, whereas Harbour Air Seaplanes is only a block or two from the recommended hotels. One-way float plane fares cost \$100-200 CAD. It's always best to make a reservation, but you can sometimes walk on. If you need to cancel and would like a refund, this needs to be done a few hours before your scheduled departure. Note that this may be a less reliable option during the winter time because of weather and the float planes stop flying at dusk.

For those on a more tight budget, there are also options to travel via public transportation (bus) to and from the ferry terminals and from YCD to downtown Nanaimo.

MEETING REGISTRATION

Participants will be able to register and pick up their information package from 8:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on the first day of each meeting. If this registration time is not convenient for you, please ask the Secretariat staff in the meeting room for your registration.

FOOD and RESTAURANTS

In addition to the two meeting receptions, the Host and Secretariat will arrange coffee breaks during mornings and afternoons of meeting days. Nanaimo has a variety of restaurants in its downtown core close to the Vancouver Island Conference Centre, within a short walk from downtown, and within a 5-20 minute taxi ride.

SOCIAL EVENTS

These are among the first scientific meetings that will be held in person following the COVID-19 pandemic. So Canada and the Secretariat are considering options to facilitate social interaction among meeting participants. There will be two receptions, a sporting activity, and a bus tour of local attractions organized by the host Member and Secretariat:
