



1. Annual catch




- China's Pacific saury fishery in the Northwest Pacific Ocean began in 2003.

2. Number of vessels




- > Sixty-six fishing vessels are operating
- > Nine vessels increased compared to last year


3. Accumulated catch



4. Seasonal catch




5. Nominal CPUE


