

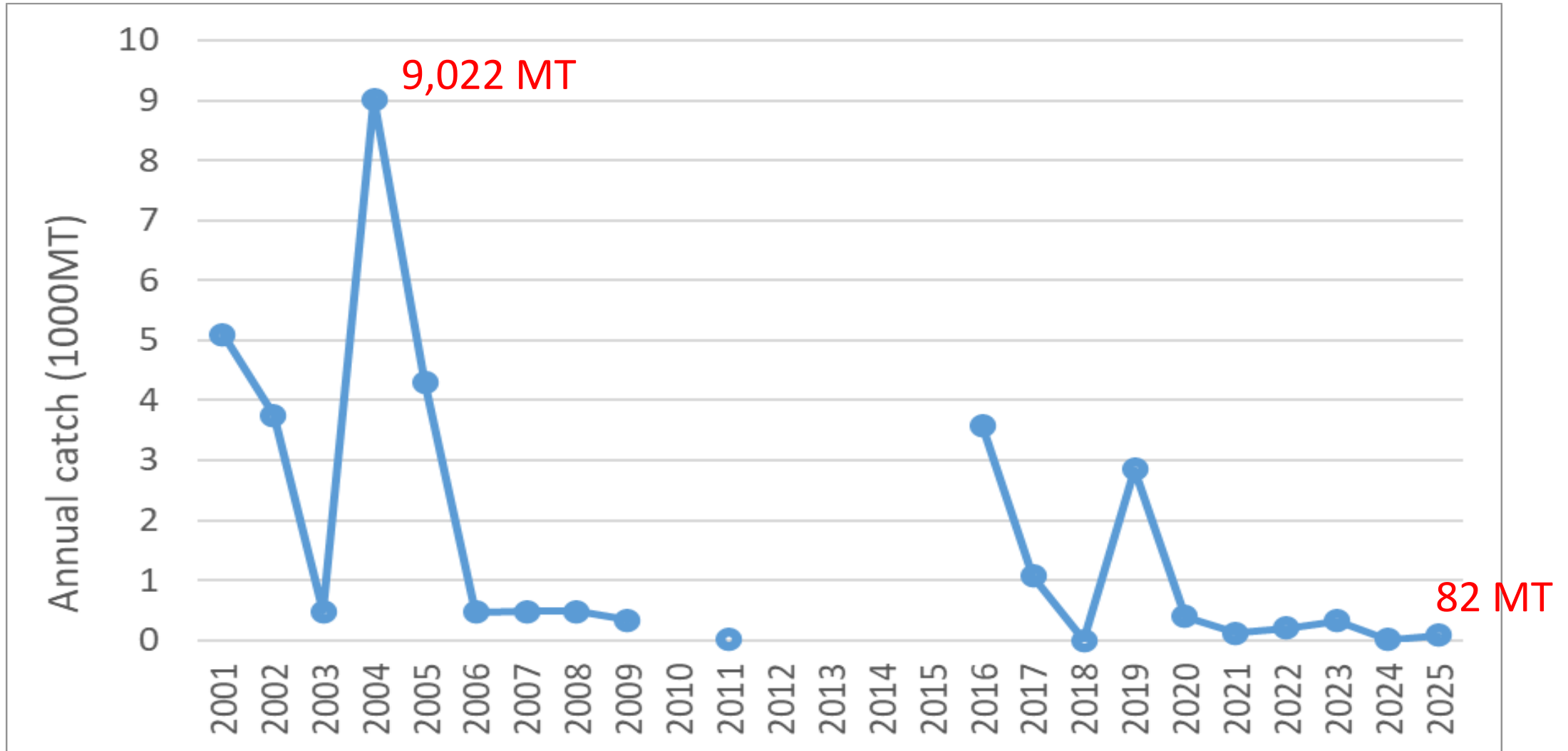

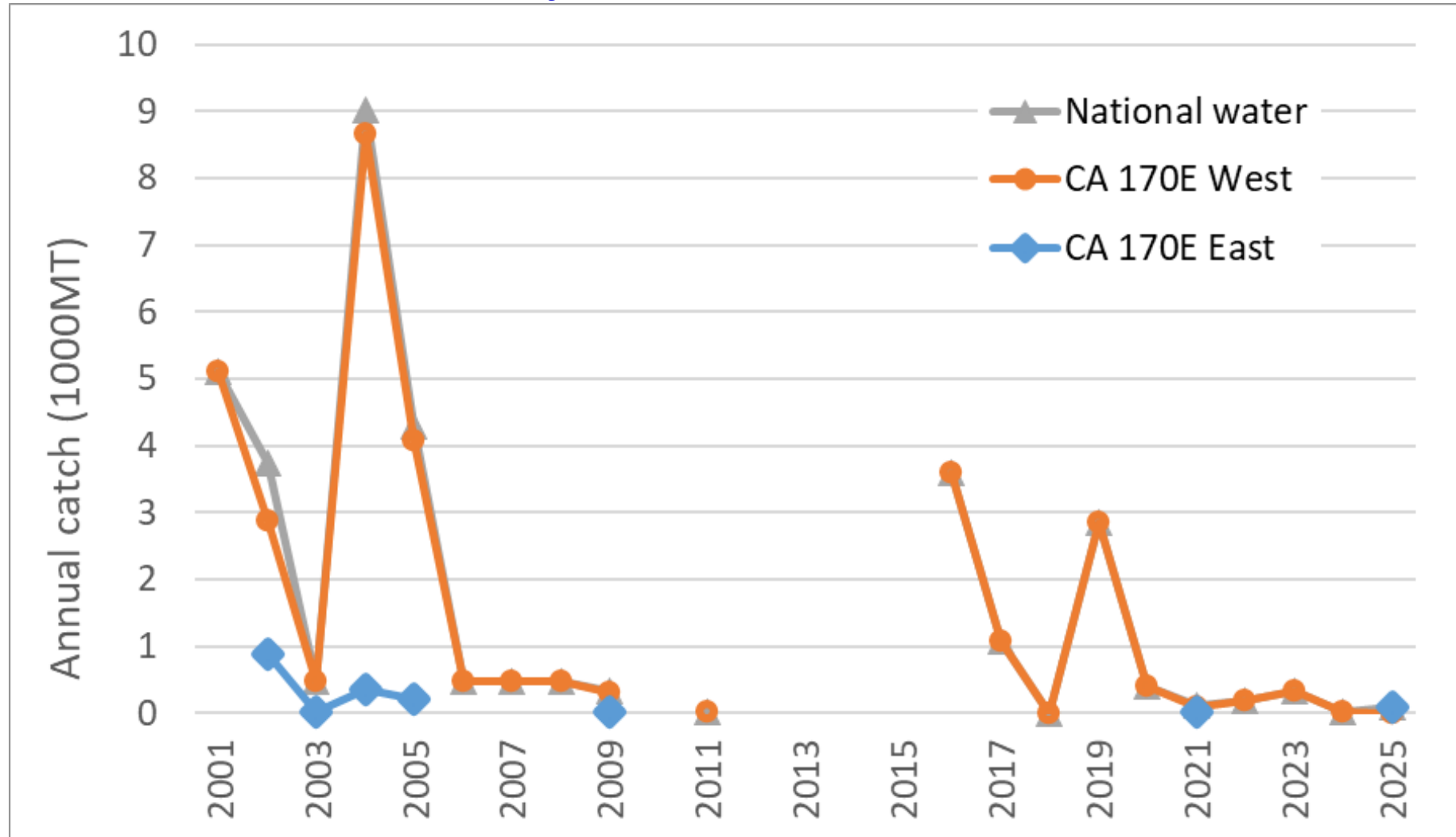


# Annual catch series



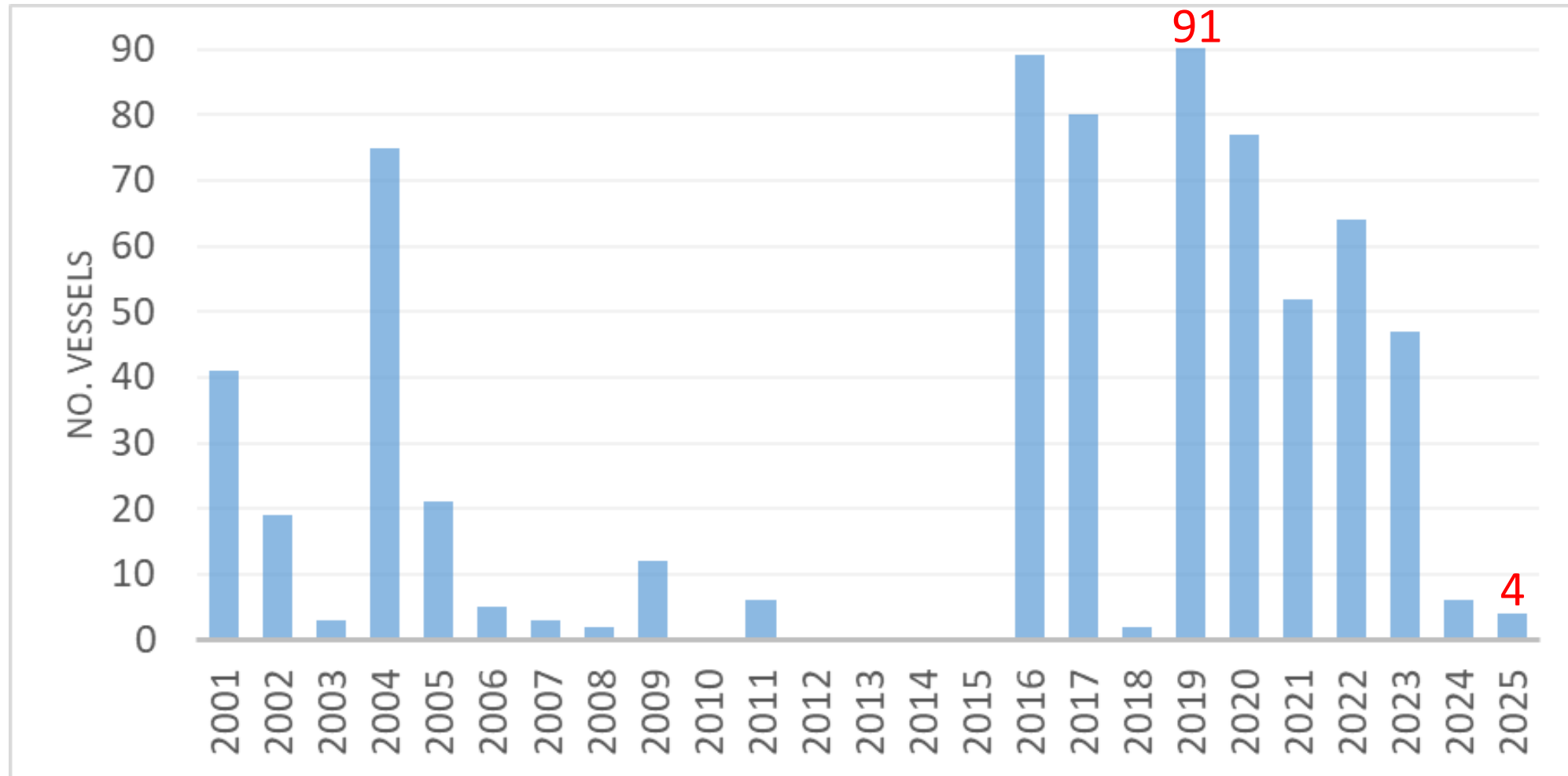
- The catch peaked in 2004.

# Annual catch by area



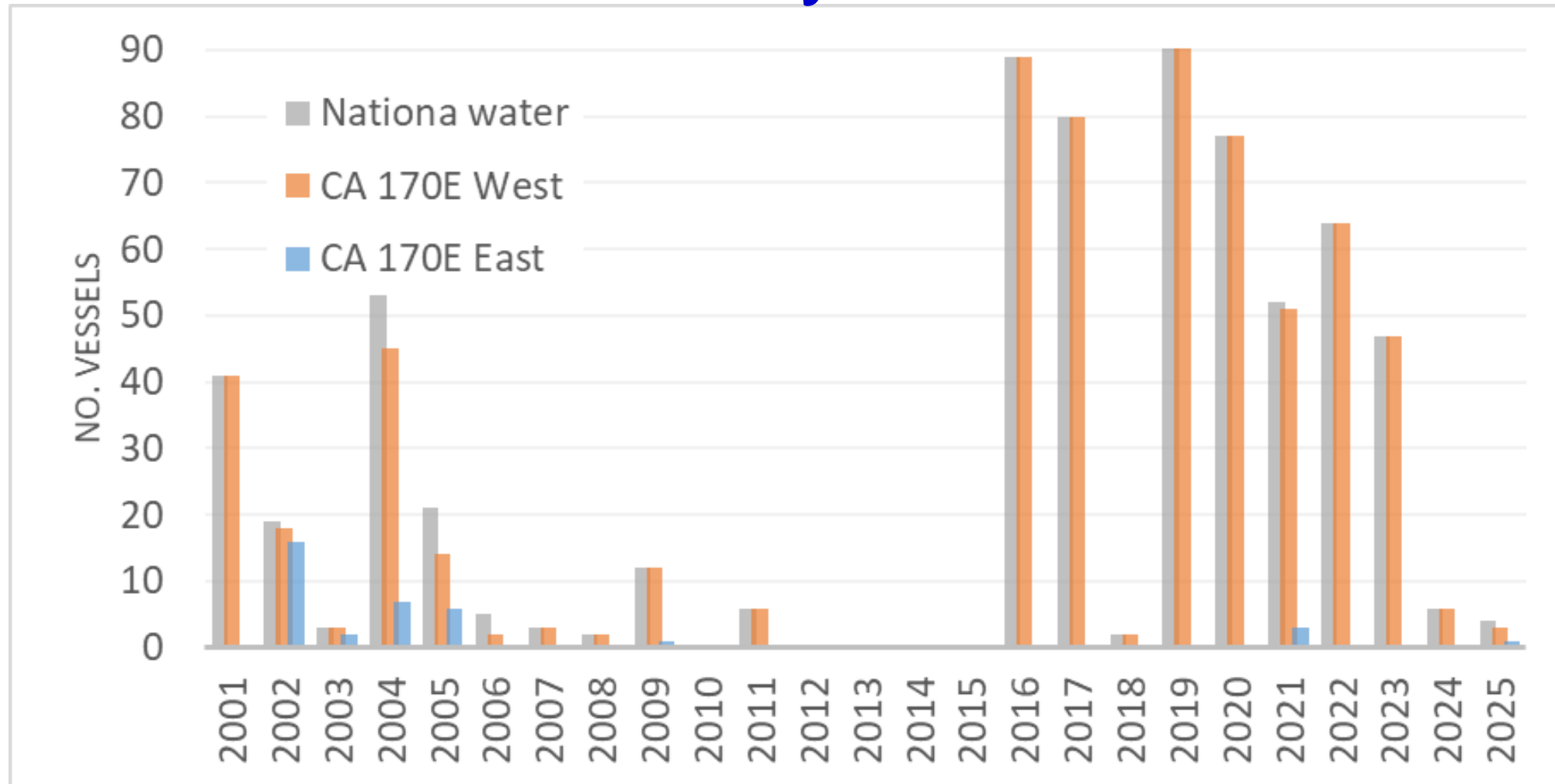
- The catch was mainly from the western region.

- Only 4 vessels harvested squid in 2025.

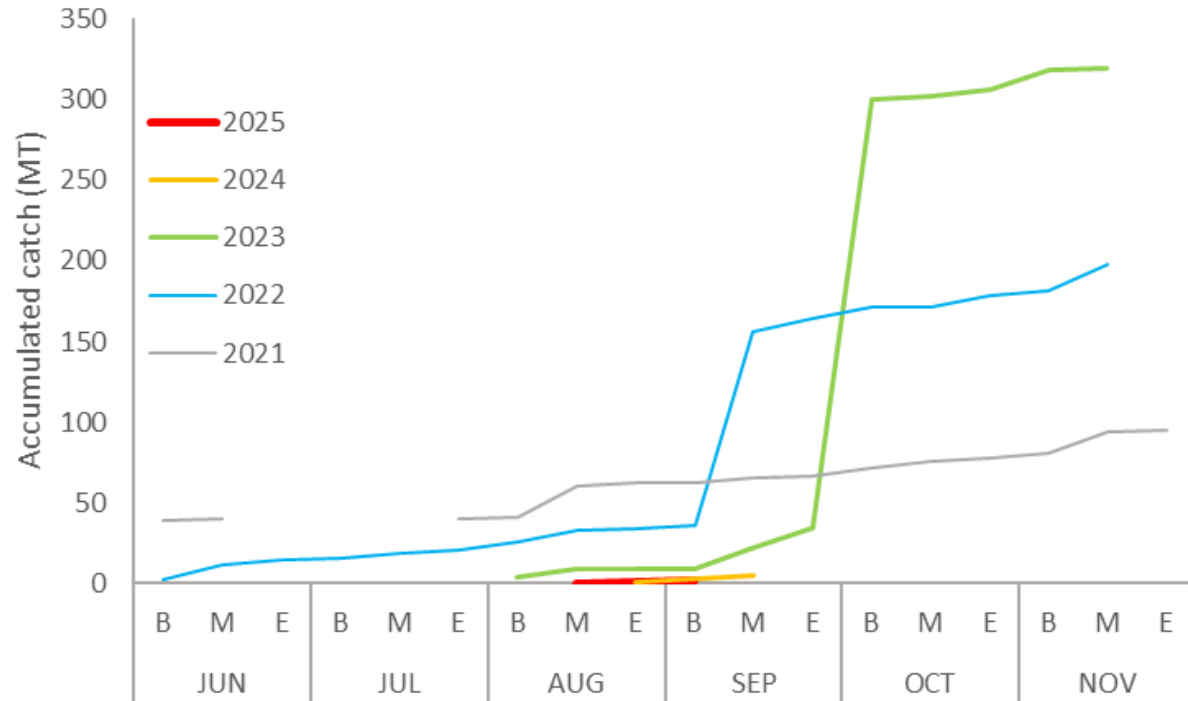
# Number of vessels by area



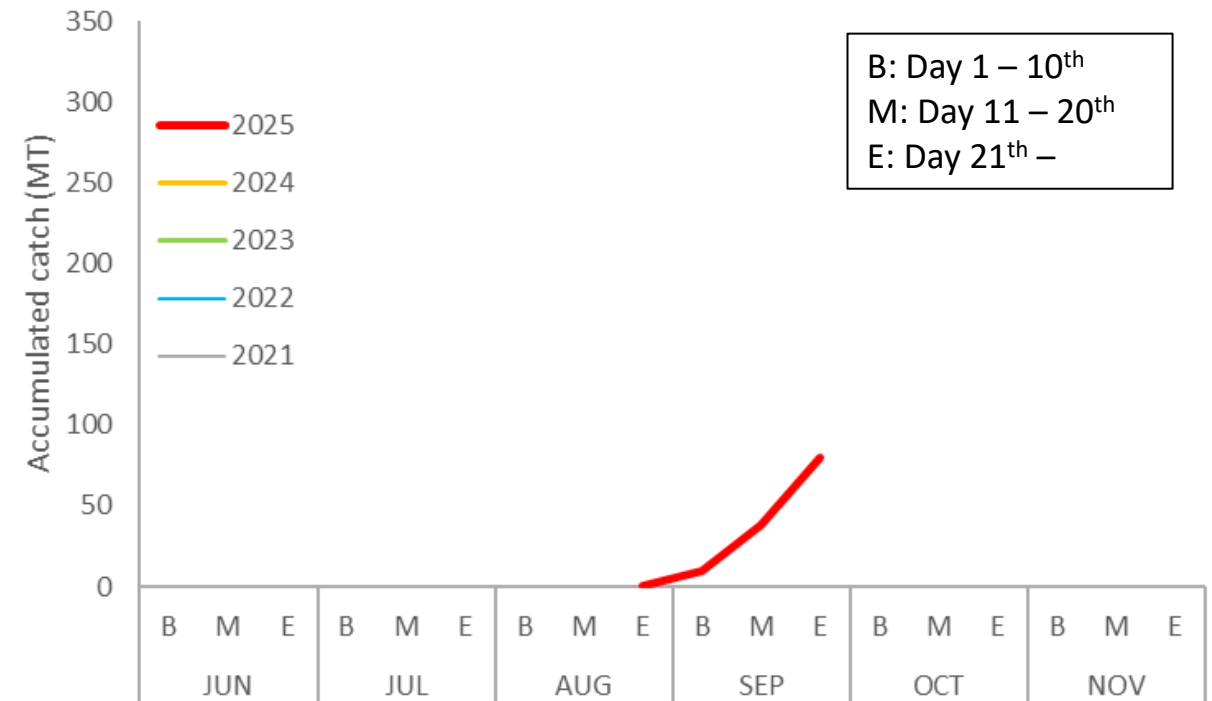
- A single vessel operated in the eastern region during 2025.

West of 170°E



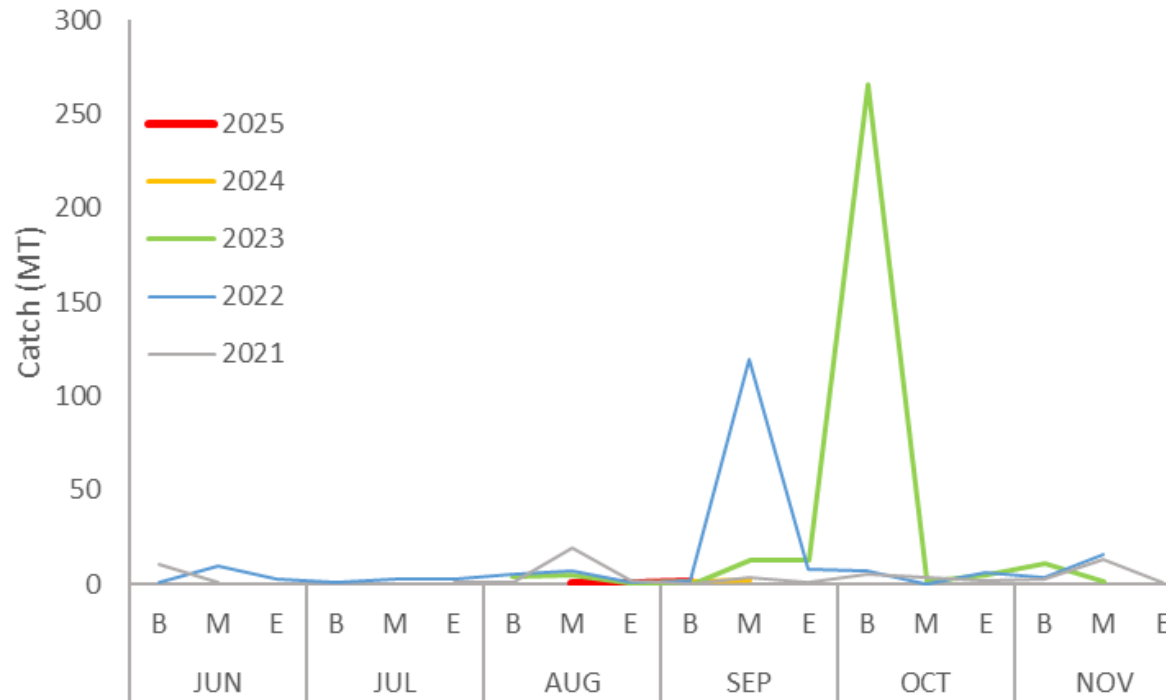
East of 170°E



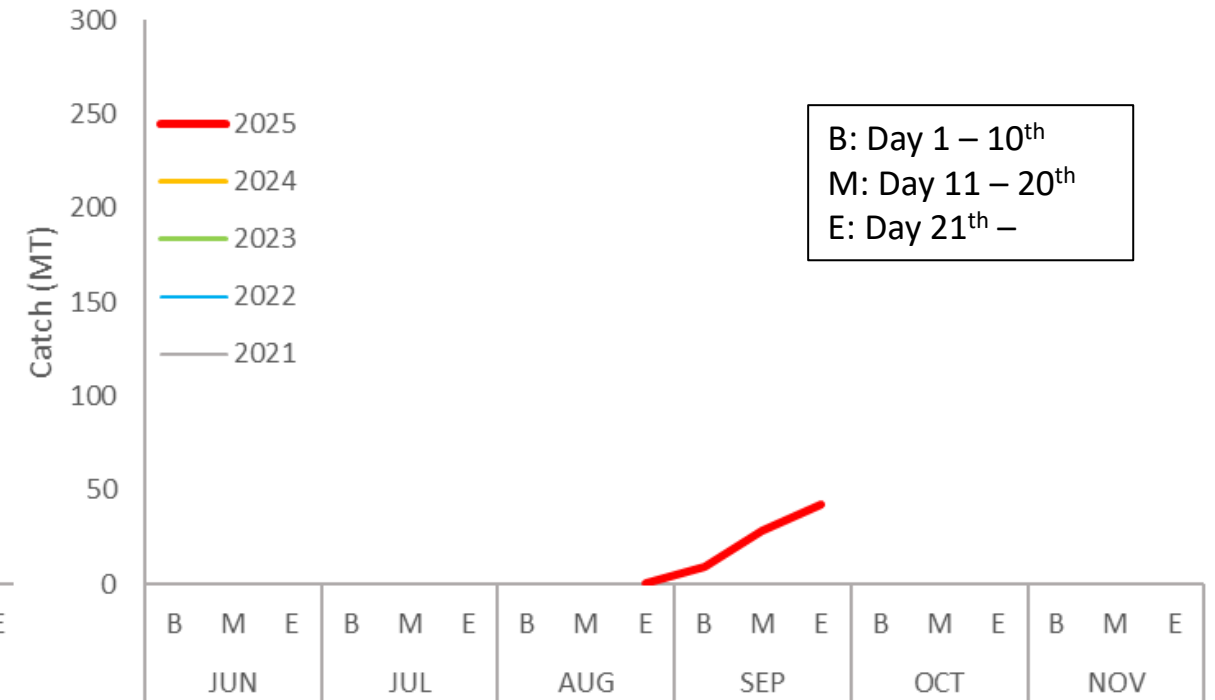
- In 2025, only 4 vessels operated from August to September.

West of 170°E

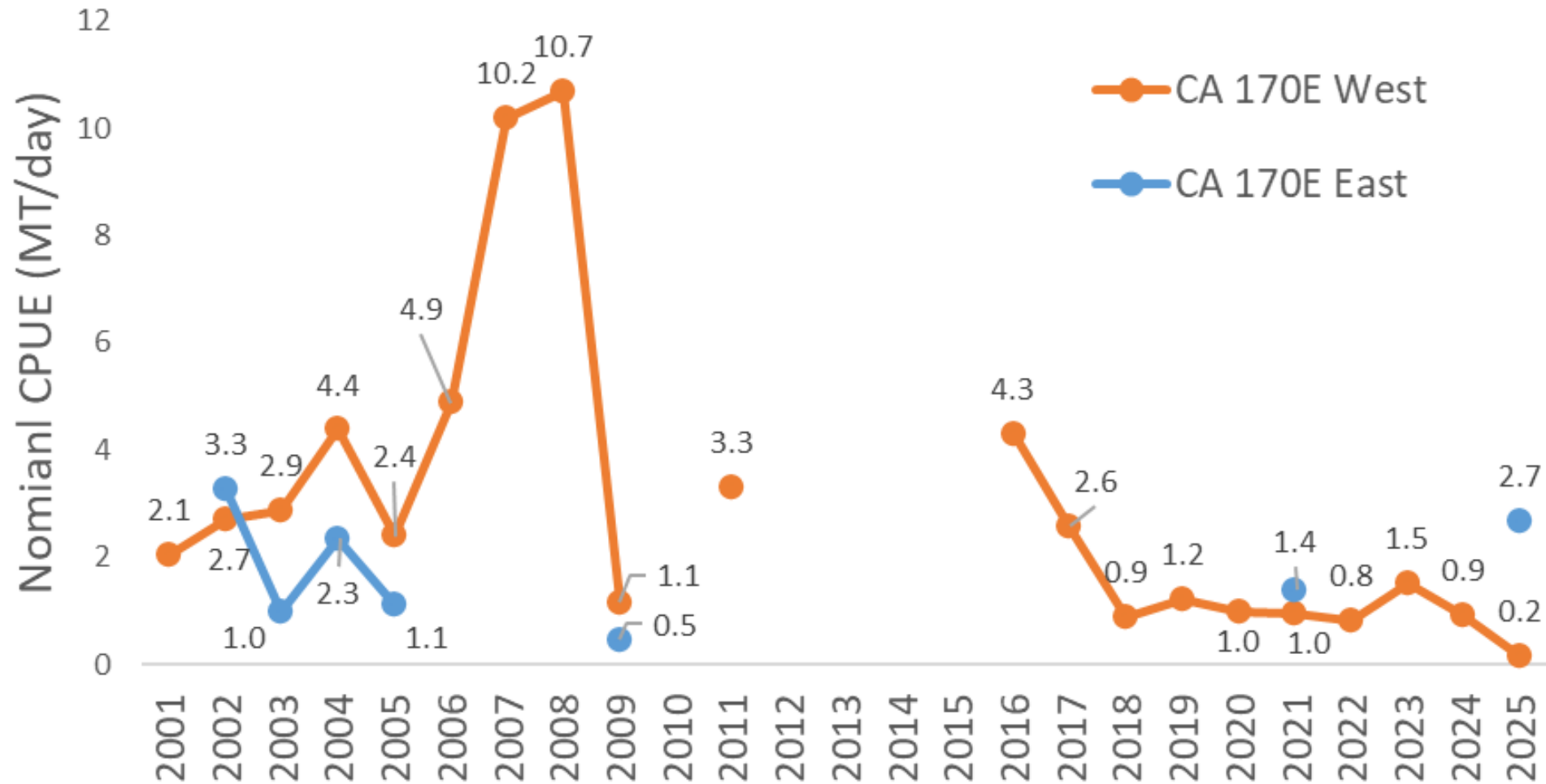


East of 170°E

# Nominal CPUE

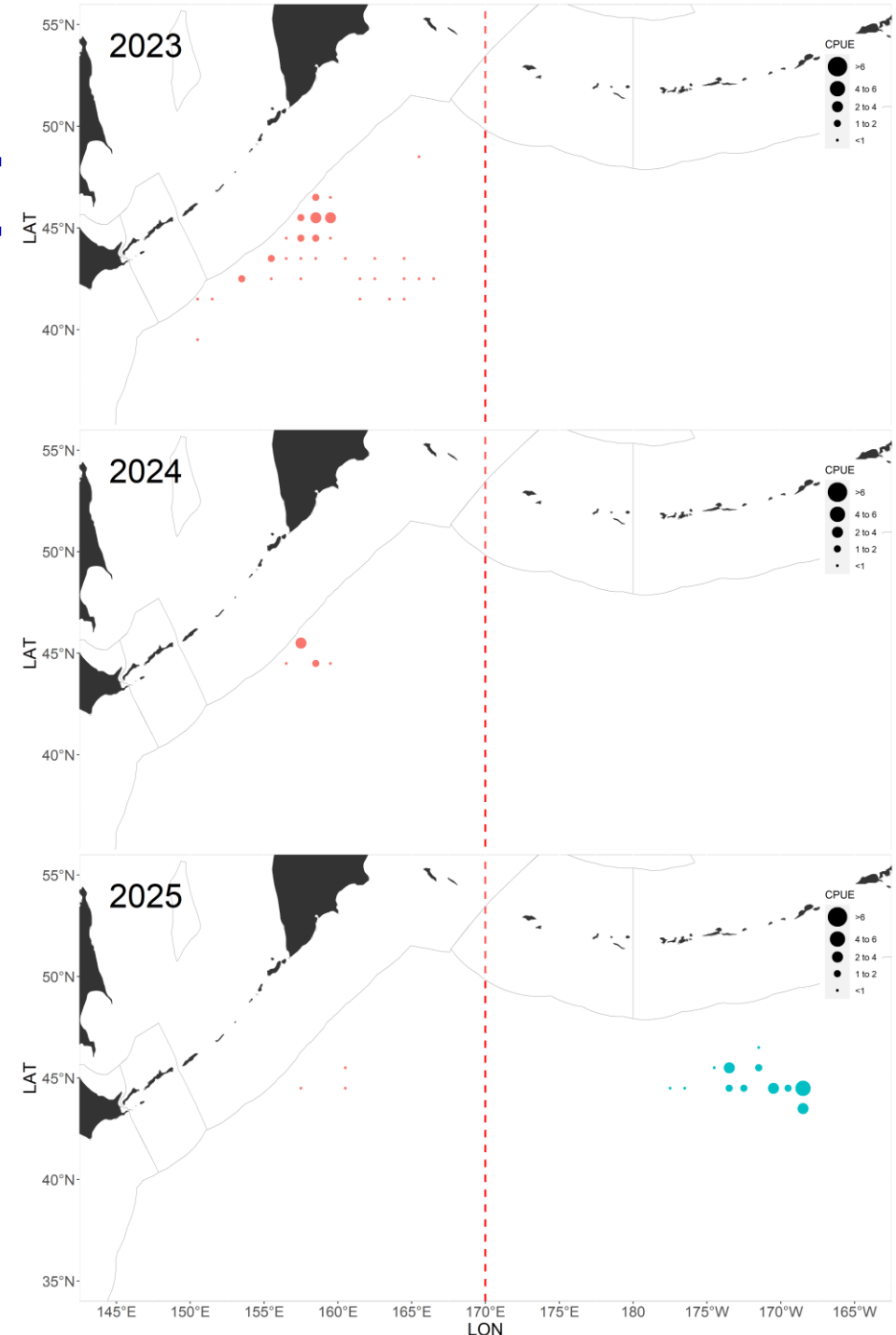


- Nominal CPUE was higher in the eastern region in 2025.

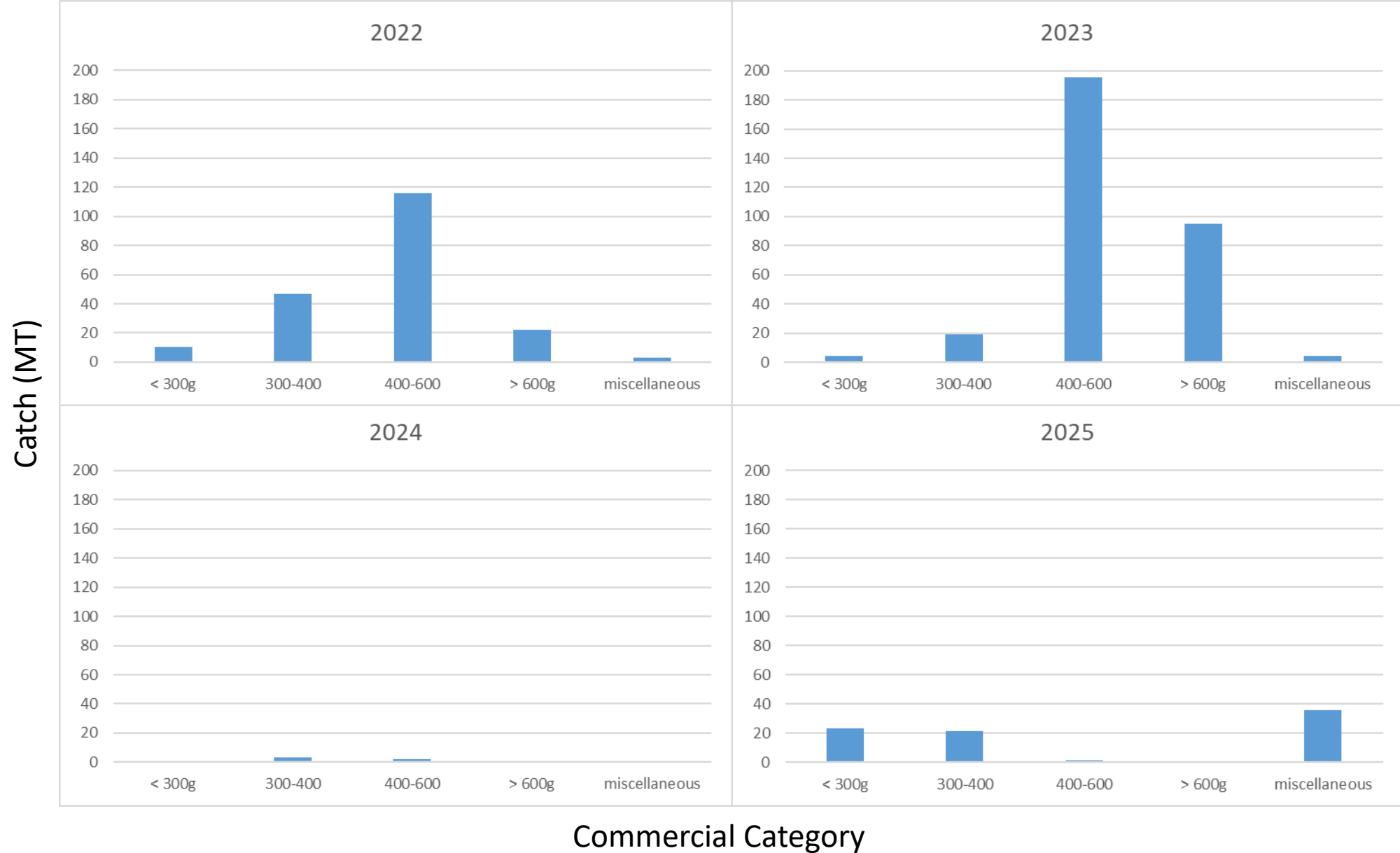


# Spatial nominal CPUE

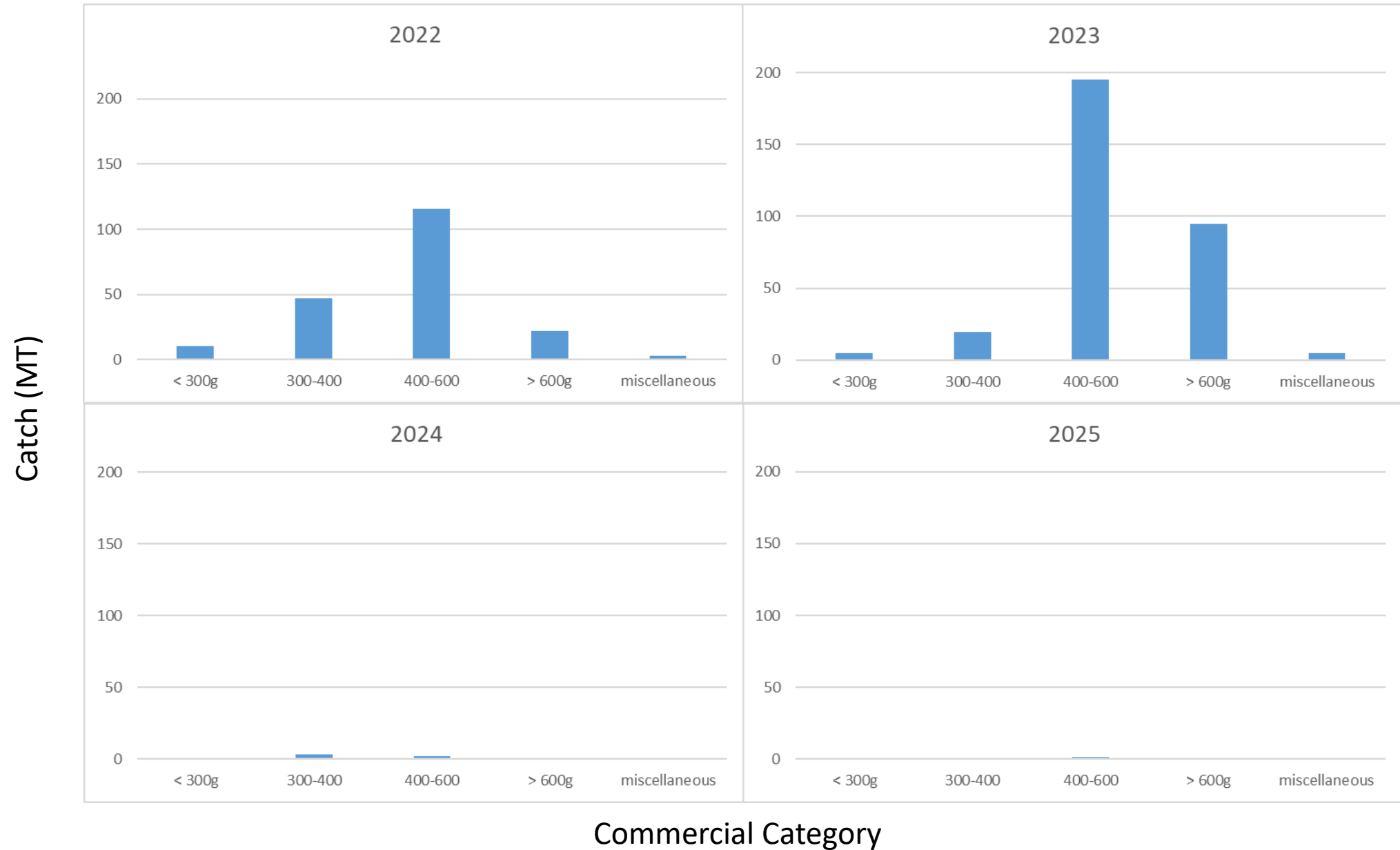
- The fishing grounds in 2025 expanded compared to recent years, with one fishing vessel operating in the eastern region.



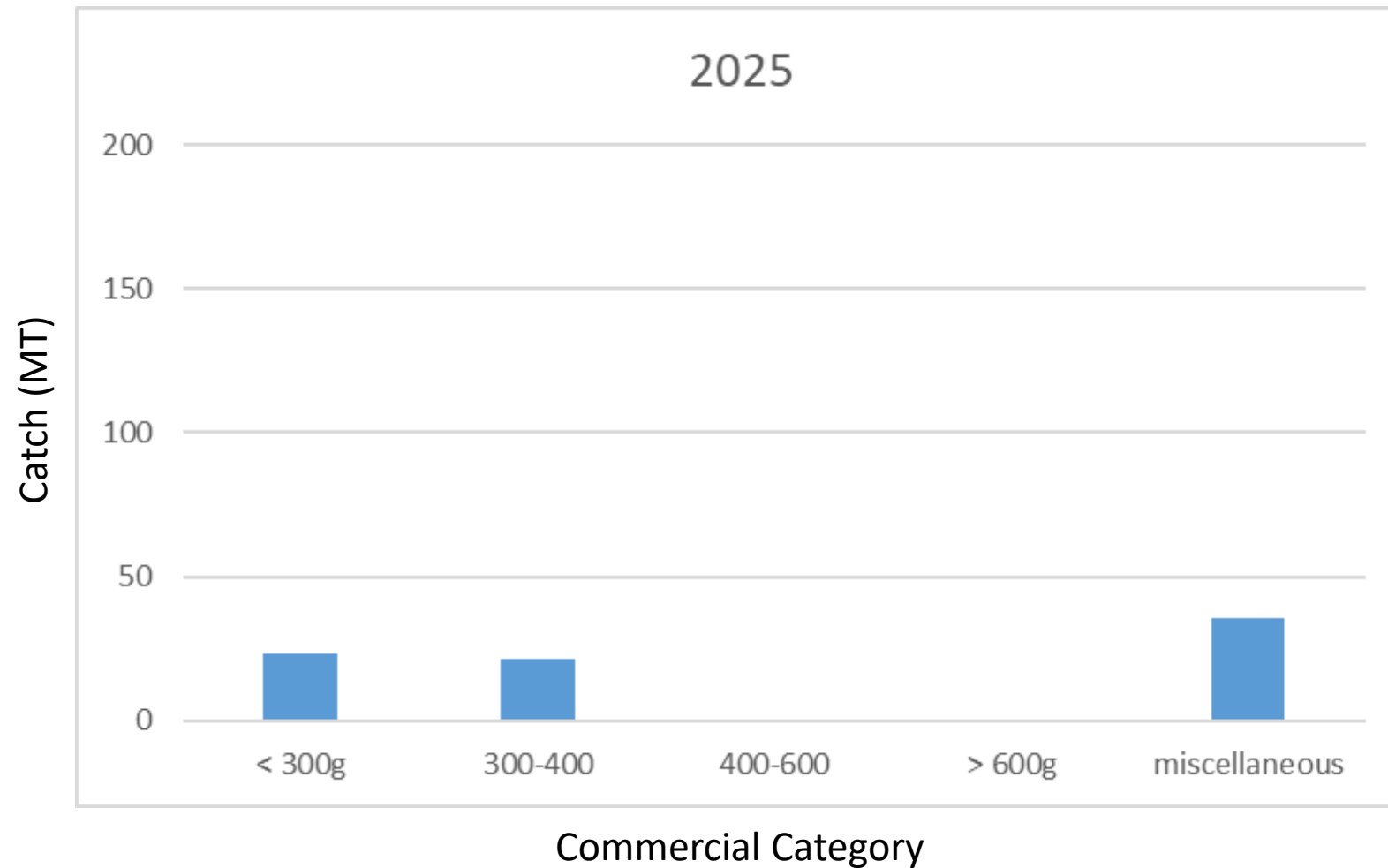
# Commercial category in catch by year

# Description of methods for obtaining size composition

- Captains are utilizing commercial weight categories when reporting daily catch data via the electronic logbook system.
- The commercial weight categories are classified into the following groups: <300 g; 300-400 g; 400-600 g; >600 g; and miscellaneous.
